Name _____ Date Causes Consequences Québec leaders were concerned that traditional values were being eroded by growing urbanization. Many businesses in Québec were run by anglophone Canadians and Americans. Some people began to call for the preservation of traditional Québec culture. Some felt that the most important foundation of Québec culture was their religious faith. Maurice Duplessis pursued policies based on Groulx's ideas, resisting outside influences that might undermine traditional rural values in Québec. The relationship between the Union Nationale and the Church became one of mutual support. People began to criticize the Duplessis government for holding Québec back and the Church for limiting individuals' freedoms. The Liberal Party's platform of change was implemented, beginning the Quiet Revolution. A period of rapid social change began—for example, women no longer had the legal status of a minor. Québécois wanted the development of a social safety net.
