Preparing a Bibliography

For a book:

Author's last name, first name. Title of book underlined. Place of publication: Publisher, copyright year.

Example:

Lisser, Beth. <u>Science Links 9</u>. Whitby: McGraw-Hill Ryerson Publishing, 2009, pp. 552–555.

For an encyclopedia article where the author is given:

Author's last name, first name. "Title of article." <u>Name of encyclopedia</u>. Copyright year. Volume number, page(s).

Example:

Lisser, Beth. "Charged Particles." <u>The Canadian Encyclopedia</u>. 2009. Volume 2, pp. 124–130.

For an encyclopedia article where the author is not given:

"Title of article." Name of encyclopedia. Copyright year. Volume number, page(s).

Example:

"Charged Particles." The Canadian Encyclopedia. 2009. Volume 2, pp. 124–130.

For a magazine or newspaper article:

Author's last name, first name. "Title or headline of article." <u>Name of magazine or newspaper</u>. Date of magazine or newspaper, page(s).

Example:

Lisser, Beth. "Charged Particles." Science in the Classroom. September, 2009, p. 34.

For an Internet address:

Author's last name, first name. "Title of item." [Online] Available http://address/filename, date of document or download.

Example:

Lisser, Beth. "Charged Particles." [Online] Available

For audiovisual sources:

<u>Title of material</u>. Type of material. Place of publication: Publisher, copyright date.

Example:

Charged Particles. Videotape. Whitby: McGraw-Hill Ryerson Publishing, 2009.

For a CD-ROM/DVD:

"Article title." CD-ROM or DVD title. Format (CD-ROM or DVD). Copyright date.

Example:

"Charged Particles." Science Links 9. DVD. 2009.

For an interview:

Name of person interviewed (last name first). Kind of interview. Date.

Example:

Lisser, Beth. Personal interview. September 07, 2009.
