EXERCISE 2

Below are 21 arguments that (arguably) illustrate each of the 21 fallacies in the Informal Logic Fallacy Toolkit Reference Sheet. Match each argument to a fallacy by placing a number from 1 to 21 (in accordance with the reference sheet) in the space provided. One of the "arguments" is not actually an argument. For this one, write NA for no argument.

- 1. It is impossible for a feather to be dark in colour, for a feather is light and whatever is light is not dark.
- 2. Lying is wrong. When Deidre lied to her mother about her mother's hairdo, even though it was to protect her mother from ugly facts, she acted immorally.
- 3. Our team is the most outstanding team in the league, because it has the best players and the best coach. We know it has the best players and the best coach because it will win the league title. It will win the league title because it deserves to win the league title since it is the most outstanding team in the league.
- 4. "This jigsaw puzzle, when assembled, is circular in shape. Therefore, each piece is circular in shape." (Hurley, Patrick J. (1988). A Concise Introduction to Logic (3rd Edition). Belmont, California: Wadsworth Publishing Company, p. 149)
- 5. The mason employed on the building of a house may be quite ignorant of its general design, or at any rate, he may not keep it constantly in mind. So it is with man: in working through the days and hours of his life, he takes little thought of the character of his life as a whole.
- 6. If the federal government requires each gun owner to register his gun, then what will be next? Will we have to register our baseball bats, which, after all, can be used as a weapon? And what about a bread knife? Once we allow one infringement on our personal rights, other infringements will soon follow.
- 7. "People are not all the same. Isn't that obvious? I mean, they look different, they have different tastes, different interests, different values, different experiences. This idea that people are just people is silly because it blurs over all the fascinating and wonderful idiosyncrasies that make individuals what they are. In like manner, I apprehend, the sole evidence it is possible to produce that anything is desirable [meaning worthwhile], is that people do actually desire it." - 10. If cigarettes were carcinogens, then every person who smokes would come down with cancer. But this is not so; some heavy smokers live to their 90s and die not of cancer, but of boredom.

Prove that I did not have a past life as a Mongol warrior and another past life as a Greek slave maiden! Because you cannot prove that I am wrong, I am clearly right.
- 18. A: "Look, we should hold the house cross-country run at the Varsity Stadium because it makes for easy access for all of our students regarding the logistics of getting to and from the venue and it is a safe place to hold a run." B's response: "I disagree! It has been a long-standing tradition of our school to hold the run at High Park. Therefore, we should continue to hold the run at High Park."
