## **Ongoing Assessment**

## Accommodations

**ESL**—Allow students to use a dictionary or translator when completing the questions in the Chapter 8 Review.

**Motor**—Give students extra time to complete these questions, or allow them to do fewer questions, making sure they do examples of each type of question.

## **Teaching Suggestions**

- The Chapter Review is organized by chapter sections and is designed to review the concepts presented in this chapter.
- One approach is to assign one section of the Chapter Review to the class, have students work on it individually, then compare their solutions with a partner. This provides the opportunity for students to discuss the solutions and resolve any difficulties they may have had. Then, have students proceed to the next section and repeat the process. If students have difficulty, encourage them to refer to their notes or the student text for similar problems. When necessary, provide solutions for students who are struggling with particular questions.
- Alternatively, have the class work on the entire review either individually or in pairs.
- Encourage students to flag the questions that caused them the most problems, indicating that these are the ones they will need to focus on when studying.
- Once the review questions have been completed, you may wish to assign the Practice Test that follows the review.
